Report of the Student Grievance Redressal Cell for the Academic Year 2018-2019

The Grievance Redressal Cell functions with the Principal as the head and senior faculty members as coordinators. The cell functions according to the UGC norms in order to address the sensitive issues that need patient listening and understanding. Proper care is taken to provide redressal in the form of needy action.

In our institution, Grievances will be handled in a 3-tier system

Teacher Level- Students can visit the faculty for minor grievances and the concerned faculty deals with the issue in the primary level.

Department Level- If the faculty member is unable to handle the situation, then the matter is forwarded to the concerned HOD. The HOD with the help other faculty members will find a remedy

College Level- If the matter is serious and cannot be handled at the Department level, then the Principal and the grievance redressal cell will take up the issue and find a solution.

Objectives

- To foster a responsible and accountable attitude among all the stakeholders and thus to maintain a harmonious ambience in the institution.
- To uphold the legacy of the institution by ensuring a cordial atmosphere with its stakeholders, making it amicable to them.
- To communicate constantly with the stakeholders so as to listen patiently their concerns and grievances and to find out immediate solutions for their concerns in due time.

Policy

The following measures are established to ensure a grievance free campus:

1. The institution is obliged to maintain strong and immediate redressal steps for the students grievances.
2. The Student Grievance Cell and Anti-Ragging Cell work efficiently under the chairmanship of the Principal.
3. Wide Awareness on Anti-ragging policy is disseminated through college Handbook & Calendar which is distributed at the beginning of the academic year.
4. Obtaining signed affidavit from parents and students against ragging.

5. An effective and efficient Anti-ragging Cell and an Anti-ragging Squad is functioning in the college so as to ensure the fraternity among SGCians. The members of the Cells meet regularly and submit the reports to the Principal.

6. The Principal of the College directly supervises the functions of the grievance and anti ragging Cells and takes constant feedbacks from the teachers concerned.

7. The institution can identify, properly illuminate and keep a close watch on all locations known to be vulnerable to occurrences of ragging incidents.

8. Vulnerable areas are strictly under CCTV Surveillance.

9. Special guidelines and instructions are provided to the senior batches just before the arrival of the freshers, focusing on the laws regarding ragging or other forms of harassments.

10. The class tutors are instructed to keep vigilance on the students, identify the trouble-triggers and give them proper instructions considering ragging as a cognizable offence.

11. Counselling facilities are provided by professional counsellors once in a week and the students can make use of this facility.

12. The Principal addresses the freshers on the commencement day itself and ensures their protection and safety within the campus and its premises. The convenors of the cells like Anti- Ragging Committee and Student Grievance Redressal Committee would speak on the policies of the college and give an awareness to the students and their parents.

13. Special sessions are arranged for the newcomers in the Induction programme in the first weeks of the academic year in order to adapt themselves to the new socio-academic life in the campus.

14. The respective HODS and class tutors keep constant vigil on the new comers and the students can address their concerns and lodge their complaints on issues of ragging to the teachers.

15. Mentoring will be done effectively during this period so as to provide a conducive learning environment to them.

16. Ascertaining Zero tolerance towards ragging: Any student who is found guilty of ragging is seriously dealt with as per the university regulations. The case should also be reported to the law and order department of the state immediately at the reception of any such complaint at the college office.

17. Updated information will be provided on the college website with the contact details of nodal officers related to anti-ragging committee.

Procedure for Redressal of Grievance

An aggrieved student shall first submit his/her complaint in writing to his/her mentor (class teacher) who shall resolve the grievance within two days. In case the mentor is not able to resolve the grievance, he/she shall forward it to the chairman of the Departmental Level Grievance Committee.

The chairman of the Departmental Committee shall convene a meeting of the committee within two days of receiving the complaint from the faculty mentor or from the aggrieved student in case he/she applies directly to the committee. The chairman shall attempt to resolve the grievance within a week of the receipt of the complaint and an action taken report is to be prepared.

If the student is not satisfied with the solution of the department level committee, he/she shall appeal to the college level committee giving the reasons for his/her dissatisfaction with the decision within a week of receipt of the decision of the department level committee.

The chairman of the College level redressal committee shall convene a meeting of the committee with two days of receiving the complaint. The College level committee shall verify the facts and shall either

endorse or amend the decision of the Departmental level committee and issue an appropriate order within a week of receipt of the grievance.

If the student is not satisfied with the redressal offered by the College Level Grievance Redressal Committee he /she can submit an appeal to the Manager of the College within a week of receipt of the decision with all relevant details.

The Manager shall review the decision and pass an appropriate order. The manager, if needed may recommend, necessary corrective action , to ensure avoidance of recurrence of similar grievance at the College. At all levels a fair hearing shall be given to all parties at all levels/committees.

The common grievances and needs of the students are addressed through the College Union and appropriate actions are taken on the same.

REPORTED CASES DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2018-19

As the impact of stringent measures adopted by various cells and departments in the college to prevent any kind of harassment no severe cases were reported during the academic year. Only two minor issues were reported and the grievance cell had resolved it in a short time. The institution maintained a peaceful and student friendly atmosphere through out the academic year.
